Dr Alexander Chiu graduated from Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1993. He then joined United Christian Hospital in which he rotated through different specialties including accident and emergency, medicine and intensive care. In his early years , Dr Chiu's main research interest was in cardiac troponins and his work was awarded the young investigator award by the Japanese Circulation society and the best thesis award by the Hong Kong college of Physician. After he joined Queen Mary Hospital, he started working with Professor ST Fan on artificial liver support in which he produced a series of papers as well as a chapter in the latest edition of the critical care nephrology. Dr Chiu has also liaised with other pioneers around Asia to form the critical organ support technology group (COST) which is an newly found organization dedicated to promote and facilitate the research in extracorporeal technology.
